Springdale Preparatory School will be a new, a co-educational, boarding school and day school located at what is currently the Brethren Service Center. A college preparatory school with a diverse student population from Maryland counties, other states across the country, and from all over the world, Springdale will offer rigorous academics while equipping all learners with the tools needed to meet all of life's challenges.

Cristina and Bob Hamilton are pleased to be the newest members of New Windsor's business community at 405 High Street. They look forward to making improvements to the property in order to further Bob's interest in restoring classic mahogany boats and renting garage bays on the lower level to store cars, boats or equipment. The plans for the upper level of the property are for office/retail and indoor ministorage. Bob and Cristina look forward to getting involved in the community and meeting the office/personal storage space needs of New Windsor businesses and residents.

Dielman Inn update: I think everyone is extremely pleased with the new appearance of the Dielman Inn. As you know, the Council approved a bid of \$211,000 for the Lead Paint Abatement and painting of the exterior at Dielman Inn. The Town received a \$450,000 grant from the Maryland Department of Housing & Community Development (DHCD) to fund this project. DHCD approved \$143,716 of the remaining funds for additional work on the exterior of the Inn. The work is scheduled to begin on April 17.

The largest portion of the lagoon remediation has been completed. We recently approved funding for G.E. Fielder & Associates to develop a master plan for the 31 acres which includes the Lions Club ball field, the lagoon area, public works facility, tennis courts and picnic shelter. The study is scheduled to begin April 1. Community input will be welcomed. This master plan will guide the development of public works and recreation facilities that will be very beneficial to the town for many years. Open community meetings will be announced as soon as the dates are scheduled.

Streetscape Project: We will soon begin working on one of our responsibilities of Streetscape. This project will be the lining of sewer lines on High & Main Streets. The lining or cured-in-place pipe (CIPP) system creates a protective, structural pipe inside the existing host pipe system, without digging or destruction to the landscape. Once this is done, we will see a reduction in what is called Inflow and Infiltration or I & I. This is used to describe the ways that groundwater and stormwater enter into our sewer system. This usually happens after a rain in which groundwater gets into the sewer line through cracks in the pipes. Once this project is completed, there will be less water entering the wastewater treatment plant. The schedule for this project is to bid project in March, award the bid in May, and begin work in June. There will be periodic short interruptions in sewer service, we will notify everyone when this is to happen and have a schedule posted on the Town's website when work is scheduled.

New Services Available to New Windsor Residents

RSVP Carroll County announces two new services that are now available to help senior and other residents of New Windsor and the surrounding areas.

The Food Pantry at Frederick Scott Key High School, 3825 Bark Hill Road, is now open to all residents every Tuesday from 3:00-4:00. Canned goods, bakery items and other pantry staples may be picked up at no cost. It is not necessary to show proof of household income to obtain groceries, and participants are encouraged to take an extra bag of groceries to deliver to a friend or neighbor. To find the Food Pantry, go to the back parking lot of the school and use the entrance near the flagpole.

RSVP Volunteers will deliver groceries to anyone who does not have transportation to get to the school, those over age 55 or those who have physical limitations that make it difficult to carry grocery bags. Call RSVP at 410-386-4646 to request home delivery through Seniors with Groceries project.

Transportation assistance is now available to cancer patients who find it difficult to get to their medical appointments. RSVP Volunteers for the American Cancer Society's "Road to Recovery Program" will pick up patients at their home, and provide transportation at no cost to treatment appointments in the county. Call the American Cancer Society at 410-781-6909 to request transportation assistance.

RSVP stands for Retired and Senior Volunteer Program, which is a branch of the Senior Corps, a federally supported program through the same agency which administers AmeriCorps and Vista. The program recruits volunteers age 55+ to provide needed services in Carroll County through established non-profits.

RSVP volunteers serve with Meals and Wheels, health and wellness partnerships, soup kitchens, and food pantries to address food insecurity for older, home-bound residents. Many seniors must make the choice between eating healthy food and paying rent or buying critically needed medicine, and RSVP volunteers serve in programs that help seniors to live better, more healthy lives.

RSVP Carroll County addresses the concerns of the community by harnessing the power, wisdom and experience of seniors age 55+. A few minutes or hours per week can make a significant difference in the lives of others.

Here are some commonly asked questions regarding Municipal Elections. If you have additional questions, please call the Town Clerk at (410) 635-6575.

When Are the Town of New Windsor Elections Held?

There is a General Election for the Town of New Windsor every two years. The Mayor serves a four (4) year term and the Council serves a four (4) year term.

On the second Tuesday in May in every odd-numbered year, The Town of New Windsor will either elect the Mayor and two (2) Council members or three (3) Council members.

How Do I Register To Vote?

Oualified residents of the Town may register to vote at the Carroll County Board of Supervisors of Elections. They are located at 300 S. Center Street, Rm. 212 in Westminster, MD 21157-5248. Registration forms are also available at the New Windsor Town Office, 211 High Street, New Windsor, MD.

Requirements to Vote

Town residents who have resided in the State of Maryland for at least one year prior to May 09, 2017 who have resided within the corporate limits of the Town of New Windsor for at least six months prior to May 09, 2017 and have registered with the Carroll County Board of Supervisors of Elections are eligible to vote in the May 2017 election.

Can I Vote In the Town of New Windsor Elections By Absentee Ballot?

Yes, you can vote by absentee ballot.

How Do I Obtain An Absentee Ballot?

To obtain an absentee ballot you must make an application. Absentee balloting is governed by strict regulations and Maryland State Laws. To apply for an absentee ballot call the Town Clerk at (410) 635-6575.
