MAYOR ROOP'S MESSAGE

On Monday, February 29, 2016, the Town of New Windsor was rocked. Not by an earthquake, not by a tractor trailer hitting the high curb at Main & High Streets. It was rocked by the unexpected passing of Councilman Wayne Blacksten. My report for this edition of the Town newsletter is dedicated to Wayne.

For those who knew Wayne and called him friend, he will be remembered in so many ways. Some will remember Wayne for his love of God, family, friends and community. Most will remember Wayne for his kindness, friendly smile and special laugh. To paraphrase a quote from Will Rodgers, Wayne never met a man he didn't like. Perhaps in Wayne's case, he never met a man that didn't like him.

Let me talk about a few of these things in detail. Wayne's love of community went back 56 years when he was only 15 and he joined the Westminster Municipal Band. Wayne's love of music and dedication to playing in the band for 56 years was admired by his fellow band members. Wayne was an active member of the New Windsor Lions Club for 35 years. He recently received the "Unsung Hero Award" from his fellow Lions Club members. Wayne was always working behind the scenes, making sure things got done.

Wayne was an active member of the New Windsor Fire Company for 45 years, holding positions of President, Vice-President, Board of Directors, Truck Foreman and Chairman of the Grounds Committee to name a few. During those 45 years, Wayne responded to 2,696 fire calls and 527 ambulance calls for a total of 3,223 responses. Along with those responses, Wayne averaged 125 hours of volunteer service annually to the fire company. A true example of volunteerism!

When former Councilman Kevin Null accepted the County Administrator position in Garrett County, a vacancy was created. Wayne stepped up and put his name in for consideration. On September 14, 2015, Wayne was unanimously chosen to fill the vacancy. Although Wayne's time on the council was brief, he made an instant impact on the town. As Chairman of the Public Works committee, Wayne put 110% into his responsibilities. Quickly meeting, and of course, befriending our town workers and learning what they did and what was needed from him. He even rode "shotgun" during snowstorm Jonas for a better understanding of snow plowing.

Wayne's total combined volunteer community service was 136 years. One can only wonder how many people Wayne helped, lives touched and friends made. Wayne was a dedicated and loving husband and father to Darlene and Lynne. A man of strong faith, a true and faithful servant of the Lord. The particulars I will leave private to those who knew Wayne. Cherish those memories.

To my friend Wayne, I hope that not your death, but your life and contributions to mankind are an inspiration to others to step up, get involved, and make a difference in their communities. You will be missed, yet never forgotten.

YARD WASTE

Yard Waste will be picked up on the first and third **Wednesdays** of each month starting April 6 and ending in October. Yard Waste includes grass cuttings, leaves, shrub clippings, flowers, small plants and branches not over 4 inches in diameter or 4 foot in length. Branches must be tied in bundles. Yard waste should be placed in brown paper bags or containers that can be easily dumped; these containers should not weigh over 40 pounds.



Bulk trash is for large items that cannot go with regular trash, with the exceptions of paint cans, concrete, tires and building materials.

Acceptable Items: computer monitors, computer laptop's scanners, cables and cords.

Bulk trash must be brought to the Public Works facility located on Geer Lane. Identifications will be required to show that you live within corporate limits.

WATER/SEWER BILL PAYMENT PROCEDURE

QUARTERLY PAYMENT PROCEDURE

- Meters are read in the last week of March, June, September and December.
- Bills are prepared and mailed out the first week in January, April, July and October
- Bills are sent to the property owners, regardless of who is living in the home. If tenant makes a request, a duplicate billing can be sent to them. The owner still receives the original bill.
- The property owner, and/or tenant have 30 days from when the bills are mailed out to pay the bill without penalties. The due date is printed on the bill. Payments are due in full.
- On the 31st day after payment is due, a \$20.00 late fee is added and the property owner has 15 additional days to pay the bill.
- After those additional 15 days, the property owner is charged additional late fee of \$30.00 and a notice is sent to the homeowner with a new due date.
- A termination notice is posted on the property door 3-5 days before termination day.
- Termination date is approximately 60 days after the original bills were sent out.

MONTHLY PAYMENTS PROCEDURE

- Meters are read in the last week of March, June, September and December.
- Bills are prepared and mailed out the first week in January, April, July and October.
- Bills are sent to the property owners, regardless of who is living in the home. If tenant makes a request, a duplicate billing can be sent to them. The owner still receives the original bill.
- The property owner, and/or tenant have until the 20th of the month to pay the monthly bill without any penalties. The monthly due dates are printed on the bill. Payments are due in full.
- If the monthly payment is not received by the 20th a \$20.00 late fee is added. Monthly reminders notices will not be sent.
- If the late monthly payment, late fee and subsequent monthly payment are not received by the 20th of the following month the property owner is charged an additional late fee of \$30.00 and a notice is sent to the homeowner. Payment is due by the 20th of the next month.
- If all outstanding monthly payments and late fees are not received by the 20th a termination notice is posted on the property door. Water service will be terminated 3-5 days after the notice is posted.
