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# Minutes – Town Council Meeting May 3, 2017

<u>Call to Order:</u> Mayor Roop called the Town Council meeting to Order at 7:00 p.m.

**<u>Pledge of Allegiance:</u>** Mayor Roop led the Pledge.

## **Lagoon Decommissioning**

Condon's will begin the grading work to smooth out the bottom of the lagoons as soon as weather permits. Grace Fielder has begun work on the master plan. She will do an initial presentation at the May Work Session.

## **Dielman Inn Lead Paint Abatement**

Work has begun on the additional items. Thus far the shutters have been scraped and painted. The roof painting and the chimney repair are underway.

# **Blue Ridge Stormwater Management Retrofit**

The plans for the retrofit have been submitted to the County for final review and approval. There are about 170,000 cubic yards of dirt that will be removed from the site and hauled to the lagoons to be used as fill. To avoid having trucks going through the Blue Ridge development a temporary haul road to the old State road is being proposed.

#### **Lions Park Fire Damage**

The play equipment was damaged by fire last week. The Fire Marshall's office is investigating. The cost to repair the damage is \$8,313.00. A claim has been filed with the insurance company. The Town has a \$500.00 deductible.

#### **Bulk Trash**

About 2 ½ dumpsters of bulk trash were collected Saturday. This is slightly less than in past collections.

#### **Inlets Repairs**

There are several storm drain inlets around town that are in need of serious repair. The inlet at Union Bridge Road and Spoerlein as well as the one at Main and Water Streets have collapsed sections. Stambaugh's, Inc. has been engaged to do the repair.

# **Cured-In-Place Sewer Lining Bid Award**

Sewer lining will take place on High and Main Streets. This is the first phase of Streetscape.

A motion was made by Councilmember Palsgrove and it was  $2^{nd}$  by Councilmember Schultz and approved 5-0 to award the bid to Layne Inliner, LLC for \$226,275.00.

# **Sludge Press Design and Engineering Award**

New Windsor requested a proposal form ARRO for the design and engineering of the sludge press at the waste water treatment plant.

A motion was made by Councilmember Smith and it was 2<sup>nd</sup> by Councilmember Palsgrove and approved 5-0 to award ARRO the engineering for \$33,930.43.

#### **FY 2018 Program Open Space Funds**

Carroll County has announced the Program Open Space (POS) funding for FY2018. New Windsor is scheduled to receive funding. The Town would receive approximately \$61,000 from POS funding. Asked the Town Council to think of ideas on how we would like to spend the funds.
