#### MAYOR ROOP'S MESSAGE

Blue Ridge and College Avenue reconstruction project update. Drawings are done and the first phase of lowering a section of the water line should be put out to bid by March 25. We plan to put the second phase out to bid around May 13. This phase includes new ADA compliant sidewalks, ramps, curbs, stormwater system and paving. The lower part of College Avenue will see a substantial lowering of the pavement. This will allow for a safer access to the street from Union Bridge Road, especially for fire apparatus. This project is the result of being awarded a grant for \$673,300 from the Maryland Department of Housing and Community Development. If everything goes according to plan, the project will take about a year to complete. There will be public informational meeting on April 18, at 7:00 PM in the Community Meeting Room.

Our Streetscape project is on schedule with the completion of the sewer line lining. The next phase is the water line replacement. The design development is 65% completed and expected to be 100% completed by July 2018. We expect to put this project out to bid by the end of the year or early 2019. The project will replace 110 year old water pipes on High Street and Main Street. This project is expected to take about one year to complete. Once completed, the State Highway Administration is scheduled to begin their portion of the project. This includes the construction of ADA compliant sidewalks, ramps, curbs, pedestrian lighting and paving.

The Blue Ridge stormwater management pond project is nearly completed. There's a small amount of excavation and haul off yet to be done. It is not anticipated to do any more blasting to accomplish the work. The filter media on the bottom of the facility is in the process of being installed. Final grades have been achieved on the upper areas and top soil has been tracked in. Permanent stabilization should occur very soon. We estimate that about a week of good weather is needed to finish the project. The County is estimating the project to be completed the second week of April.

Dielman Inn update: Through the Preservation Maryland Six-to-Fix program, a foundation condition assessment was completed on February 27. Chris Weston from Old Line Architects spent an entire day examining the foundation. As I expected, some of the foundation is in need of restoration while some of the foundation is in good shape. This report will assist me with a grant application for restoration of the deteriorated parts of the foundation. Next up is the preservation planning process, part of the Preservation Maryland Six-to-Fix partnership with the Town, will assist with determining the highest and best potential use for the vacant historic structure. This will help move the site forward and ensure the long-term preservation of the site. The preservation planning will be with Heather Arnold. Ms. Arnold is the Managing Director of Public Sector Work at Streetsense. She specializes in retail market analysis, incentive planning, and merchandising strategies for downtown environments. She also leads a multi-disciplinary team on the Vibrant Streets™ initiative, which provides neighborhoods with the tools and framework necessary to create thriving retail in their communities.

As I stated in a previous newsletter, with this scope of construction projects, there may be some inconveniences. I ask everyone to be patient and understanding while these projects are underway. #### **Yard Waste**

Yard Waste will be picked up on the first and third **Wednesdays** of each month **starting April 4** and ending in October. Yard Waste includes grass cuttings, leaves, shrub clippings, flowers, small plants and branches not over 4 inches in diameter or 4 foot in length. Branches must be tied in bundles. Yard waste should be placed in brown paper bags or containers that can be easily dumped; these containers should not weigh over 40 pounds.



#### BULK TRASH SATURDAY, APRIL 28 8:00 A.M.—1:00 P.M.

Bulk trash is for large items that cannot go with regular trash, with the exceptions of paint cans, concrete, tires and building materials.

We will be accepting computer and electronic recycling. **Acceptable Items:** computer monitors, computer speakers, televisions, central processing units (CPU's), mice, keyboards, cell phones, printers, power supplies, laptop's scanners, cables and cords.

Bulk trash must be brought to the Public Works facility located on Geer Lane. Identifications will be required to show that you live within corporate limits.

#### **FuTuRe**

Fair Trash Reduction Presentation April 16, 2018 6:00 PM Community Meeting Room

The cost of collection and disposal of household waste and recycling is one of the Town's major expenses, nearly \$90,000.00 per year. This works out to about \$160.00 per year per household. Reduction of the amount of household waste generated and an increase the amount of recycling is an effective way to lower the cost.

In recent months the Mayor and Council have been discussing methods of fair household trash reduction. In cooperation with Carroll County the Mayor and Council have had a presentation on the FuTuRE program wherein household trash is reduced by as much as 40%. The Mayor and Council are evaluating whether to participate in a pilot program in New Windsor.

There will be a presentation on the FuTuRe program on April 16<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 PM in the Community Meeting Room. Residents are encouraged to attend this presentation to learn about the FuTuRe program. Resident's comments and input will be appreciated and beneficial to the Mayor and Council in their decision about participating in a pilot program.
