August 3, 2022 Town Council Minutes

 - July we made \$1,264 in interest
 - About an increase of \$12,404 a year in interest alone
 - Invested in 2 Brokered CDs
 - Total of \$250K for 2 years at 3.30% interest rate
 - \$16,772.25 in 2 years
 - Total of \$125K for 1 year at 3.00% interest rate
 - \$3,750 in 1 year
- FY22 Budget
 - General Fund
 - Total income \$2,043,676.80 w/ARPA Funds
 - Highway User Revenue over budget by \$42,705.74
 - #67 new homes admin/impact fees over budget
 - Expenses for the most part came in under budget
 - Net Income was \$1,221,958.12 includes ARPA Funds wo/\$533,261.73
 - Enterprise Fund
 - Total Income for FY22 \$2.234.026.94
 - #67 new homes added
 - Expenses over budget in a few areas
 - \$27,905.80 over budget due to water leaks/water main breaks Bowersox, Blue Ridge, Main Stret and Coe Drive
 - Net Income was \$154.621.67
