I want to thank the residents that attended the informational meeting on February 23rd regarding the water line replacement. It provided everyone with a better understanding of the project, expectations, responsibilities, and timelines. Mid-Atlantic Utilities was awarded the contract at the January Town Council meeting. Depending on the availability of materials, they plan on beginning around the 1st of June. The replacement of the aging water line on Main Street and High Street (Rte. 31) along with the new laterals and water meters is expected to be completed in the fall of 2024. Bi-weekly updates on the project will be posted on the Town's website. This project is being funded with \$4,000,000 from the State of Maryland. Please be patient and understanding during this important project.

The street paving project will continue once the weather allows it. The lower section of Church Street has been completed and the remaining portion of Church Street, Robertson Drive, Water Street, and lower Main Street will be paved as Highway User Revenue is available.

While attending the Maryland Mayors Association Winter Conference in Annapolis in February, I had the privilege and honor of meeting Governor Moore. During our brief conversation, Governor Moore suggested we set up a meeting to discuss the issues facing small municipalities. With his busy schedule during the legislative session, I anticipate the meeting will take place after the session ends in April. Of course, I invited Governor Moore to attend this year's Music on the Main.

Two Funding Requests: Congress has revived Congressionally Directed Spending requests, also known in the House of Representatives as Community Project Funding requests (earmarks). This authority allows our US Senators to direct federal funding to support local projects that enhance community priorities. I submitted \$2 million earmarks requests through US Senators Cardin and Van Hollen's offices. The other funding request I submitted to Governor Moore's office is for \$500,000 for capital projects for the Town.

Town Elections: Three seats are up for this election. Participating in **elections** is one of the key freedoms of American life. Many people in countries around the world do not have the same freedom, nor did many Americans in centuries past. No matter what you believe or whom you support, it is important to exercise your rights. More information on the election is in this newsletter. We will have a candidate's forum on April 25, 7:00 PM at Town Hall, and will be aired live and recorded for viewing later. I encourage everyone to watch the forum to be able to understand the issues and get to know the candidates.

Being adequately informed is a democratic duty, just as the vote is a democratic right. A misinformed electorate, voting without knowledge, is not a true democracy.

Yard Waste Collection Reminders:

1. Yard waste can be put in brown paper yard waste bags (can be purchased at Walmart, Lowes or Home Depot).
2. Yard waste can be put into cans. Please make sure lids fit and holes are drilled in the bottom of the cans for drainage. Please NO cans that are broken and/or have sharp edges.
3. Tree limbs can NOT exceed more than 4 ft. long and 4 inch in diameter and must be tied into bundles.
4. Please NO DOG Waste!!
5. Call the Town Office to see if a dumpster is available during flooding events or inclement weather.
6. Please do not mix trash into yard waste.

BULK TRASH SATURDAY, MAY 6TH 8:00 A.M.—12:00 P.M.

Bulk trash is for large items that cannot go with regular trash, with the exceptions of paint cans, concrete, tires and building materials.

Accepting bulk metal, such as appliances, lawn mowers, etc.

If residents wish to recycle computers and electronics they need to take it to the recycling center at the County Landfill. If not, they will be thrown in with the regular bulk trash.

Bulk trash must be brought to the Public Works facility located on Geer Lane. Identifications will be required to show that you live within corporate limits.

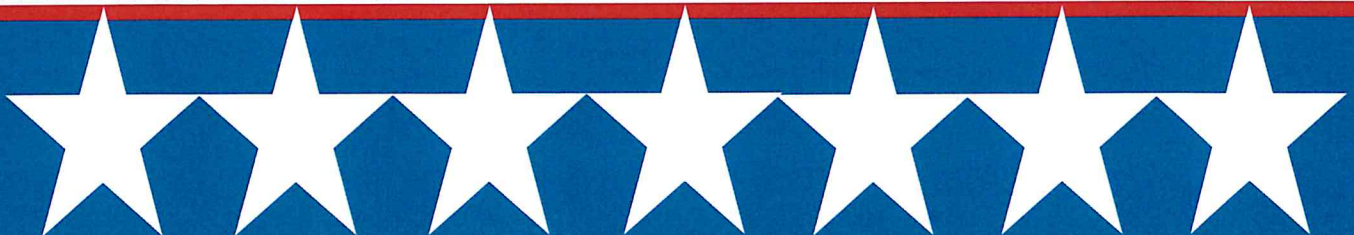

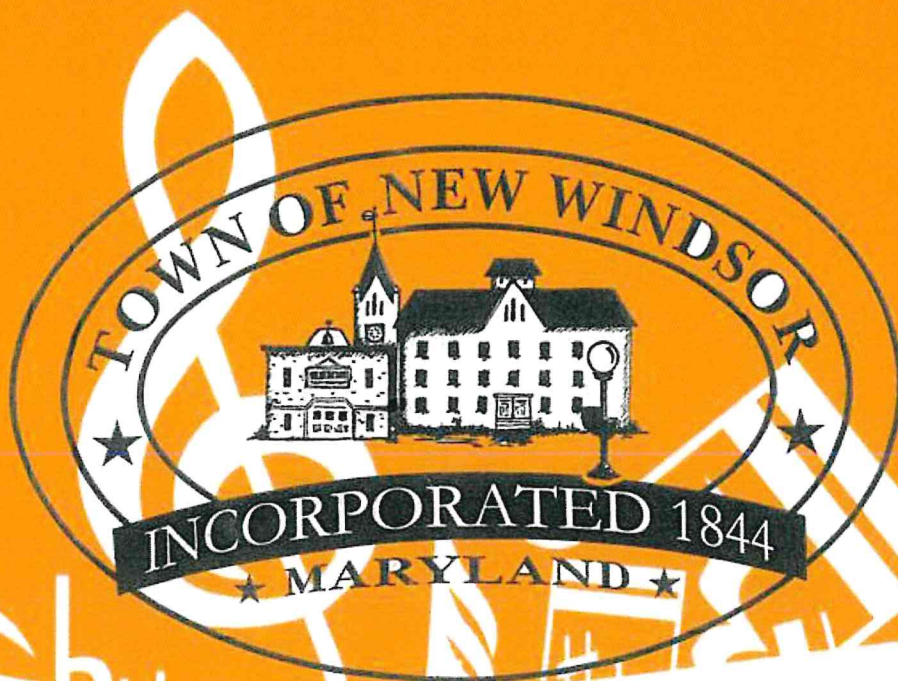
