MAYOR ROOP'S MESSAGE

MD-31 Water Main Project

As warm temperatures arrive, there will be more activity with the project. I ask that you be understanding and patient with the construction on High and Main Street. While it can be inconvenient in the short term, it is ultimately for the betterment of the Town.



The project progress is updated every two weeks on the Town's website and official Facebook page. Once the water main improvement project is completed, the Maryland State Highway Administration (SHA) is expected to begin its responsibilities on MD-31. This will include new ADA-compliant sidewalks and ramps, retaining walls, curbs, pedestrian lighting, and paving. Below are two renditions of what the Town plans for the 400 block of High Street to look like.

TRASH/RECYCLING PICK-UP IS WEDNESDAY EACH WEEK UNLESS SPECIFIED IN THE TOWN CALENDAR.

CHECK NEWSLETTER and WEBSITE CALENDARS FOR SCHEDULE CHANGES DUE TO HOLIDAYS.

Your trash must be taken out the night before to ensure pick up.

Each stop may have up to 3 trash containers of household refuse per week with each container limited to 25 pounds.

Each stop may also have up to 3 recycle toters per week with each toter limited to 25 pounds.

If you are in need of a recycle toter, please call Town Hall at 410-635-6575.



YARD WASTE Begins Thursday, April 4th! Collection Reminders:

- Yard waste can be put in brown paper yard waste bags (can be purchased at Walmart, Lowes or Home Depot.
- 2. Yard waste can be put into cans. Please make sure lids fit and holes are drilled in the bottom of the cans for drainage. Please NO cans that are broken and/or have sharp edges.
- 3. Tree limbs can NOT exceed more than 4 ft. long and 4 inch in diameter and must be tied into bundles.
- 4. Anything too big for pick up may be taken to the Geer Lane dumpster.
- 5. Please NO DOG WASTE or trash mixed into yard waste!!

Dates on the calendars are firm, unless an emergency or inclement weather occurs.

RAIN DATES WILL BE THE FOLLOWING MONDAY!

BULK TRASH DAY—Rain or Shine!

SATURDAY, APRIL 27th 8:00 A.M.—12:00 P.M.

Bulk trash is for large items that cannot go with regular trash, with the exceptions of paint cans, concrete, tires and building materials.

Accepting bulk metal, such as appliances, lawn mowers, etc.

If residents wish to recycle computers and electronics they need to take it to the recycling center at the County Landfill. If not, they will be thrown in with the regular bulk trash.

Bulk trash must be brought to the Public Works facility located on Geer Lane. Identification will be required to show proof you reside within town limits.

For more than 35 years, Human Services Programs (HSP) of Carroll County, Inc., has served as Carroll County's Community Action Agency – leading the fight against poverty.

"HSP gives HOPE, inspires CHANGE, and provides OPPORTUNITY by mobilizing our community in the fight against poverty," said Scott Yard, executive director of HSP. "That is our mission statement. We believe with the right supports in place, everyone can embrace hope, make meaningful changes, and capitalize on opportunities that will lead them to a fulfilling, self-sufficient life."

HSP's services are designed to address the root causes of poverty, as well as compliment and leverage public services. "Our programming has significantly diversified throughout the years to address varying needs," Yard said.

HSP's Economic Mobility (EM) program is an example of just that. EM encompasses Financial Education (FE) Services, Opportunity WORKS – employment support for high-barrier participants, and HSP's Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) Site, which prepares free tax returns, year-round, for low-to-moderate income households (less than \$64,000 in 2023).

An IRS-sponsored, volunteer-based program, VITA promotes taxpayer education, accessing vital tax credits, as well as saving your refund. Last year, HSP's VITA Site prepared a total of 740 tax returns between January and June.

"Taxpayers saw an average refund of \$1,806 between state and federal refunds last year. Essentially, more than \$1.1 million went back into the community in the form of refunds," Yard said. "Basically, one out of every 3 taxpayers saved a portion of their refund, which was fantastic, as our agency employs a financial education coach to work with those individuals looking to create solid spending plans.

HSP's FE Services provide monthly financial education workshops, individual financial coaching services for up to 12 months, as well as a one-time consultation appointment. FE Services include banking, budgeting, creating savings, how to be a good tenant, reducing debt and improving your credit score.

HSP is 501(c)(3) non-profit that provides county-wide services throughout Carroll to meet basic human needs, including: shelter, housing, utility assistance, eviction prevention, integrated case management, family support and economic mobility. Assisting almost 7,000 low-to-moderate income residents annually, nearly all of the County's low-income population is served through one or more of HSP's programs.




