MAYOR ROOP'S MESSAGE



The water line replacement project remains on schedule The goal is to have the water main project completed before winter and cold weather. This crucial infrastructure upgrade aims to replace outdated pipes with modern, durable materials to ensure reliable and safe water delivery to all residents. The work will be carried out in phases over the next few months, with minimal disruption to daily life.

The project is expected to significantly improve water pressure, reduce maintenance costs, and prevent future breaks. We appreciate the community's patience and cooperation during this essential upgrade. Residents can follow the project timeline on the city website for regular updates.

Mark your calendars! Our annual Main Street event, Music on the Main will be held on Saturday, October 5. We have changed the start time to noon and will go until 6:00 PM. This street event promises fun for the whole family, featuring pit ham, beef, and turkey by the Fire Company, fried chicken and fish, french fries by Strawbridge United Methodist Church, and hot dogs and soups from St. Paul United Methodist Church.

Music will be provided by Trinidad and Tobago Baltimore Steel Orchestra (12:00 – 1:30), Sons of Parrots (2:00 - 4:00) and Half Serious (4:00 - 6:00. There will be a moon bounce, barrel train, and face painting for the kids.

This is a great opportunity for community members to come together and celebrate our town's vibrant culture. The event will take place in the 200 block of Main Street., which will be closed to vehicular traffic during the event hours. We encourage everyone to join in, support local businesses, and enjoy a fun-filled day.

I was honored to be invited by the Maryland Municipal League to speak at its Housing Symposium in August on Community Revitalization. My presentation was on the Town's grant application, Rescue to Residence. If approved, the Historic Fire Hall will be renovated into two, two-bedroom apartments. Hopefully, young, single volunteers of the fire company will live there and be able to respond to emergency calls. While at the symposium, I had the opportunity to talk about the project to Jake Day, Secretary, Department of Housing & Community Development Maryland. He was very supportive of the project and had positive comments about the application. Awards will be announced at the end of October or early November.

This grant is a key part of our strategy to enhance the quality of life for all residents, particularly in the affordable housing areas. We are optimistic about our chances and will keep the community informed about the outcome of our application.

My 9th Annual Mayor on the Square Food Drive will be held on Friday, November 22 from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Unfortunately, there are families in our community that deal with food insecurities. I'll be at Fountain Park collecting canned and non-perishable foods, personal hygiene products, monetary donations, and new or slightly used coats. Please challenge your friends, family, schools, and organizations to help make this another successful event. All donations go to the New Windsor Food Bank which is located at St Paul United Methodist Church.

Without community service, we would not have a strong quality of life. It's important to the person who serves as well as the recipient. It's the way in which we ourselves grow and develop.

TRASH/RECYCLING PICK-UP IS WEDNESDAY EACH WEEK UNLESS SPECIFIED IN THE TOWN CALENDAR.

CHECK NEWSLETTER and WEBSITE CALENDARS FOR SCHEDULE CHANGES DUE TO HOLIDAYS.

Your trash/recycling must be taken out the night before to ensure pick up.

Each stop may have up to 3 trash containers of household refuse per week with each container limited to 25 pounds.

Each stop may also have up to 3 recycle toters per week with each toter limited to 25 pounds.

YARD WASTE/LEAF PICK UP Collection Reminders:

Have yard waste out on Wednesday evening prior to pick up days. This will ensure pick up won't be missed Thursday or Friday.

NO PICK-UP in Springdale Village or The Reserve at New Windsor

Pick up begins at Snader's Summit

Yard waste ONLY accepted in brown paper yard waste bags or cans.

Tree limbs can NOT exceed more than 4 ft. long and 4 inch in diameter and must be tied into bundles.

Anything too big for pick up may be taken to the Geer Lane dumpster.

Please NO DOG WASTE or trash mixed into yard waste!!

*** There will be no street vacuuming". Please do not rake leaves to the curb.

Bulk trash is for large items that cannot go with regular trash, with the exceptions of paint cans, concrete, tires and building materials.

Accepting bulk metal, such as appliances, lawn mowers, etc.

If residents wish to recycle computers and electronics, they need to be taken to the recycling center at the County Landfill. If not, they will be thrown in with the regular bulk trash.

Bulk trash must be brought to the Public Works facility located on Geer Lane. Identification will be required to show proof you reside within town limits.



AROUND TOWN HALL

WATER AND SEWER BILLING

The Mayor and Town Council are in support and have provided the Town Water and Sewer Billing Clerk direction to actively continue pursuing delinquent/outstanding water and sewer bills. The Water and Sewer Billing Clerk will provide monthly updates at Town Council meetings and focus efforts on sending certified letters and door hanger shutoff notices, as needed, to residents delinquent on payment. The establishment and payment of water and sewer charges is in accordance with Town Code Chapter as follows:

Chapter C - CHARTER specifically C10-13 Charges

Chapter 205 – WATER AND SEWERS specifically 205-37 Water and sewer charges established

In fairness and respect for the up-to-date residents, elected officials and staff respectfully ask support and cooperation in our efforts to address the outstanding water and sewer bills and bring all residents up to date and current. The goal is continued flexibility and willingness to work with delinquent accounts to avoid shutting off water if possible. However, as a last resort the water service will be shut off.

CODE ENFORCEMENT

The Mayor and Town Council are in support and have provided the Town Code Enforcement Officer direction to actively continue pursuing code violations for unlicensed/untagged vehicles and trailers. The Code Enforcement Officer will provide monthly updates at Town Council meetings and will focus efforts on sending certified letters to property owners and vehicle owners in violation of Town Code Chapters and Sections as follow:

Chapter 189 - VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC specifically 189-13 through 16

Chapter 196 – VEHICLES, JUNK; VEHICLES UNDER REPAIR specifically 196-1 through 12

Elected officials and staff respectfully ask support and cooperation in our efforts to address these violations with the goal of peaceful, agreeable and friendly enforcement.




New Windsor Heritage Happenings!


