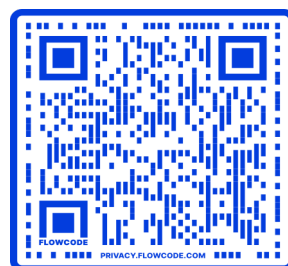

TRASH & RECYCLING PICK-UP IS WEDNESDAY EACH WEEK UNLESS SPECIFIED IN THE TOWN CALENDAR.

Your trash must be taken out the night before to ensure pick up.

Each stop may have up to 3 trash containers of household refuse per week with each container limited to 25 pounds.

Each stop may also have up to 3 recycle totes per week with each toter limited to 25 pounds.

If you are in need of a recycle toter, please call Town Hall at 410-635-6575.

BULK TRASH DAY - Rain or Shine!

Saturday, APRIL 5

8 am - 12 pm

Bulk trash is for large items that cannot go with regular trash, with the exceptions of paint cans, concrete, tires and building materials.

Accepting bulk metal, such as appliances, lawn mowers, etc.

If residents wish to recycle computers and electronics, you will need to take the items to the recycling center at the County Landfill. If not, they will be thrown in with the regular bulk trash.

Bulk trash must be brought to the Public Works facility located on Geer Lane. Identification will be required to show proof that you reside within town limits.

YARD WASTE

Begins Thursday, April 10!

Collection Reminders:

1. Yard waste can be put in brown paper yard waste bags (can be purchased at Walmart, Lowes or Home Depot).
2. Yard waste can be put into cans. Please make sure lids fit and holes are drilled in the bottom of the can for drainage. Please, NO cans that are broken and/or have sharp edges.
3. Tree limbs can NOT exceed more than 4 feet long and 4 inches in diameter and must be tied into bundles.
4. Please NO DOG WASTE or trash mixed into yard waste!!

MUNICIPAL MINUTE

Water & Sewer Updates

- The Town has experienced significant issues with collection of water and sewer usage charges, including those on rented properties, which has resulted in large arrearages owed to the Town. At a public hearing on March 5, 2025, the Mayor and Town Council adopted an ordinance to amend Chapter 205, Section 205-37. Effective July 1, 2025, all charges for water and sewer usage will be the responsibility of the property owner. Please visit the Town's webpage to view Ordinance No. 02-05-25.
- The Town is currently working with its water and sewer billing system provider to improve the look and delivery of your water and sewer bill. More information will be shared on the Town's webpage as well as its Facebook page.



Fire Hydrant Flushing

The Department of Public Works will be conducting fire hydrant flushing throughout the Town from **April 21, 2025, to May 1, 2025**. Flushing will take place on **weekdays between 9:00 AM and 3:00 PM** until the process is complete.

What to Expect:

- You may experience temporary **water discoloration**. If this occurs, run **cold water** from all faucets until it clears.
- To avoid inconvenience, **fill containers with water the night before** for drinking, cooking, and other morning needs.
- **Always test cold water first** before using hot water to prevent discolored water from entering your hot water system.
- Even if discolored, the water remains **safe and fully treated** for consumption.
- After flushing, **replace water filters and clean faucet aerators** as needed.

This process **affects all residents on the Town's public water system**.

Thoughts from the New Windsor Community Deputy

A few topics over the past several months come to mind while thinking of crime deterrence. The most common in recent months has been fraud schemes and thefts. Recently we have had individuals posing as contractors to obtain work that was solicited by knocking on doors. I encourage anyone who encounters a similar situation to get a second opinion before agreeing to the job. If the individual cannot receive "No" as an answer do not hesitate to contact us.

Additionally, frauds have become more common on computers, phones, and other electronic devices. This often is completed through phishing emails and text messages. Yes, we have had individuals pose as Carroll County Sheriff's Deputies, unfortunately. In the past, scammers would smooth talk and advise the subject they have a warrant or an unpaid ticket. They would then encourage the subject to pay them via gift cards, which should ALWAYS be a red flag. Look for misspelled words, subjects, or an uncommon email. Always do a two-factor confirmation before submitting to the potential scammer.

Lets talk about the elephant in the room - mental health. This is a subject that is not comfortable for most people to speak about, however it is probably the most important. In my ten years of service as a Carroll County Sheriff's Deputy, I will say that mental health is commonly the single largest issue I have dealt with. Yes, this is my opinion; however, I have observed that issues normally stem from poor mental health whether domestic related, financially, or even speeding egregiously. The healthier we are mentally equals better health overall. No, I am not perfect either; however the more cognizant I am of my own deficiencies the better I am at managing them. We are all human and we live in a complex world that is rapidly changing. I encourage everyone to take time for themselves. This could start as just a few minutes every day. Something is better than nothing. Take that walk, call that friend, work on the hobby that has been collecting dust. If all else fails, please do not hesitate to contact us. I am Crisis Intervention Team certified and often can leave you with a referral if the matter is not exigent. In addition to 988, below is the phone number for Santé Mobile Crisis, the County's Crisis Response Helpline.

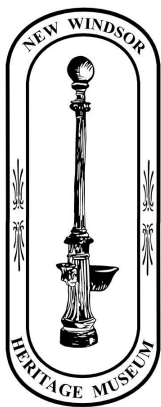

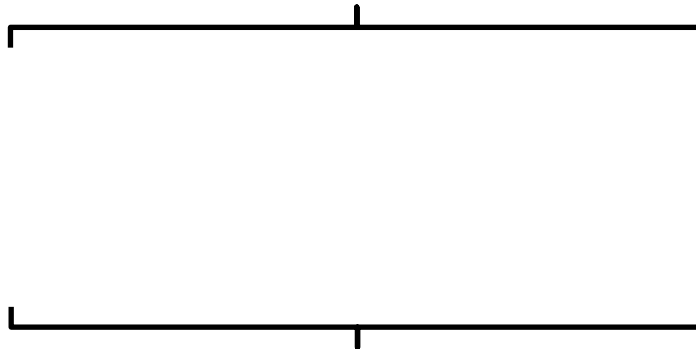
