Just a few days later, New Windsor will host the **Vietnam Traveling Memorial Wall** at the New Windsor Fire Department's Carnival Grounds, October 9 - October 13. This 3/5 scale replica of the Vietnam Memorial in Washington, DC stands six feet tall at its center and covers nearly 300' from end to end. The Wall bears the names of over 58,000 men and women serving as a reminder of the ultimate sacrifices made during the Vietnam War.

Also in October, the Town will hold its **5th Annual Franklin G. Schaeffer Memorial 5k Run/Walk event** at Wakefield Valley Park. The event will be held on Saturday, October 18 at 9 am.

In November, I will be continuing the tradition of **Mayor on the Square** started by former Mayor Roop. On November 22 from 12 pm – 4pm, and November 28 from 9 am – 12 pm, I will be at Fountain Park collecting canned and non-perishable foods, personal hygiene products and new or slightly used coats. On December 3 at 6 pm, the Town will celebrate its **Annual Tree Lighting** celebration at Fountain Park. This festive holiday event will include Christmas Carols, warm refreshments, cookies and possibly a special visitor...

TRASH & RECYCLING PICK-UP IS WEDNESDAY EACH WEEK UNLESS SPECIFIED IN THE TOWN CALENDAR.

- Your trash must be set out the night before to ensure pick up.
- Each stop may have up to 3 trash containers of household refuse per week with each container limited to 25 pounds.
- Each stop may also have up to 3 recycle totes per week with each toter limited to 25 pounds.

BULK TRASH DAY - Rain or Shine! Saturday, October 18 8 am - 12 pm

Bulk trash is for large items that cannot go with regular trash, with the exceptions of paint cans, concrete, tires and building materials.

Accepting bulk metal, such as appliances, lawn mowers, etc.

If residents wish to recycle computers and electronics, you will need to take the items to the recycling center at the County Landfill. If not, they will be thrown in with the regular bulk trash.

Bulk trash must be brought to the Public Works facility located on Geer Lane. Identification will be required to show proof that you reside within town limits.

LEAF PICK UP - Begins Monday, November 3

Collection Reminders:

1. Please do not rake leaves to the curb as there will not be street vacuuming of leaves.
2. Leaves can be put in brown paper yard waste bags (can be purchased at Walmart, Lowe's or Home Depot).
3. Leaves can also be put into cans. Please make sure lids fit and holes are drilled in the bottom of the can for drainage. Please, NO cans that are broken and/or have sharp edges.
4. Please NO DOG WASTE, dirt, stones, sticks or trash mixed into the leaves!!
5. There will not be Town pick up in Springdale Village or The Reserve at New Windsor.



MUNICIPAL MINUTE

Water & Sewer Updates

Reminder - Residents can expect water bills the first week of October. This quarterly bill will have the new tiered system rates in effect. Using the tiered system, it is estimated that 64% of residents will see a decrease in their water and sewer bills.

Snow Emergency Routes

The Town Code states parking is prohibited on designated Town Snow Emergency Routes whenever a Snow Emergency has been declared by the State Highway Administration or the Maryland State Police. Parking is prohibited until the Snow Emergency is lifted and the streets are cleared of snow. The parking prohibition applies to all vehicles including towed vehicles such as trailers and campers. Having the streets clear of parked vehicles during snow events allows the Town crews to clear the snow quickly and is safe for both Town residents and staff.

Please be advised that Maryland Transportation Article 21-1119 authorizes law enforcement officers to ticket and tow vehicles parked on snow emergency routes when a snow emergency is declared. Violators of this transportation article could be fined and will also be responsible for the tow bill, if the vehicle is in fact towed.

When a snow emergency is declared by the State Highway Administration, the Town of New Windsor will post the declaration on the Town's Website and Facebook page. Please remember to stay educated during snow events.

Whenever you hear the weatherman call for snow, play it safe and just remove your vehicle from the street so you are not burdened later with cost associated with violations.






Step Into History During **Music on the Main** – Saturday, October 4!




